

She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, **because he will save his people from their sins."**

It's a wonderful time of year for us to be happy – much to enjoy – for example, parties, poppers, presents, plum pudding, poinsettias, prancer, punch, pumpkin pie, partridge in a pear tree and all the rest of it (sorry I couldn't think of a "p for that one"). We each have our favourite aspects of Christmas. However, the external sparkly side of Christmas that we all see and know so well, and we can see on our televisions being repeated all around the world, is not really a true reflection of what is going on in people's lives.
