Alan Dickson Bridgemead Chaplaincy

Hello Everyone,

You have been hearing from me every month for about 2 years now. I became Chaplain in June 2022, and you may have seen me around the home during these last 2 years or so. If you haven't seen or met me, I hope the photo above may help you to recognise me. If you see me, do come up and introduce yourself some time.

We have had an addition to our Chaplaincy team in the last few months – Jamie Jameson – He is a retired school teacher and attends St Luke's Church, here in Bath. We thought that it might be interesting to give you some information about ourselves and about what we do at Bridgemead, Jamie is going to write next month's chaplain's piece, so I'll leave him to tell you all about himself.

Our intention and prayers are to serve the home, particularly the residents, but also their relatives if needed or wanted, and the staff. We go and invite ourselves to meet the residents individually, either in their rooms or sometimes in one of the public spaces. We just enjoy each other's company and chat to them – often about their lives, their interests, their families and their experience of Bridgemead. Sometimes we have an opportunity to speak to them about Jesus, to read to them from the Bible and to pray with them.

We are also involved with "Quiet Times" (QTs) which happen Monday to Friday 11.45-12.15 approximately ,and Sunday afternoon services at 3.30. The QTs are informal, and we sing together, and usually reflect on a short passage from the Bible. We have followed some series like the "I ams" of Jesus from John's Gospel, the miracles of Jesus, and a group of Psalms. Shortly we are going to look at some old hymns which the residents will recognise.

Sunday services are slightly more formal but are still very friendly. We follow the pattern of a typical Church of England Service, with worship, confession, prayer and Bible reading followed by a short talk.

I have not been a church vicar or church minister in the past - I was a paediatric surgeon in Manchester, working there in the hospitals for over 30 years. A lot of my patients had significant congenital disabilities and I was regularly involved in providing care for them and supporting their families. Although I retired from clinical medicine just before the Covid pandemic, I am still involved in "medicine" in various ways.

As a Christian, throughout my life I have tried to communicate God's love, and the message of Jesus to others. Since I have lived in Bath, God has given me several opportunities to serve Him and to reach out to others with the good news of the Bible. I am a member of St Bart's Church of England in Oldfield Park and I am involved there in several roles. I am also the chairman of the local branch of Good News For Everyone (GNFE), formerly Gideons UK – the organisation which places copies of the Bible or New Testament in places like hotels and hospitals – some of you will have seen the Bibles in these places.

One of my favourite verses In the Bible is John 14 verse 6. "Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me". This verse tells us Jesus is the only way to God. Jesus died on the cross outside the city of Jerusalem in Israel 2000 years ago for our sins, so that if we repent and trust Jesus, we can be forgiven, and know God as our heavenly father.

Allow me to encourage you to read the whole chapter in the Bible - Chapter 14 in the Gospel of John. If you haven't got a Bible, you can find it on the internet – link below.

Trustee Message

How much can life change in 6 months!

In all my years of involvement with Bridgemead I have never experienced "care" so closely as in the last couple of months. I've had friends from Church who have been residents, but never a close family member.

It gives you such a different perspective on Bridgemead as opposed to looking at figures on a spreadsheet, doing Trustee inspections or being in and out of the building for meetings.

Observing the welcome, patience, care and love given to a close family member is something that has had a profound effect on me and one which will have a lasting impact.

My Dad did not have long at Bridgemead, but the time he spent there was happy and fulfilled. The opportunity to have visits from family members avoided any sense of isolation. Contact is so important.

Having experienced the recent loss of both parents one in hospital and one in Bridgemead, I was also struck by how important it was for Dad to have the opportunity to spend his final hours in the privacy of his own "space", cared for by people who have got to know him well. This seemed to provide dignity which is perhaps not as easy to achieve in a hospital setting.

Long may Bridgemead continue to do what it does so well!

As Trustees, we are continuing to press ahead with work on the Flood Resilience Project, with the aim of going out to tender soon. I remember when the building was originally being designed, 30+ years ago, I had no idea how important the input of engineers was in building design and construction. Naively, I thought architects did it all. The engineering challenges as we work to maintain the building continue.

In all my time as a Trustee, John Todman has been central in all aspects of work to do with the building. John was appointed a Trustee in December 2013 and has served faithfully since that time in many roles and has made an immeasurable contribution to the work of Bridgemead. We thank God for John and we will miss his wisdom in Trustee meetings. Happy retirement, John!
