#### "Who is this?"

"Who is this? Even the winds and waves obey him!" Mark 4:41

It is not necessarily the long passages in the Bible which are most significant; sometimes the short ones are really profound. In each of the first three gospels we find the account of Jesus calming the storm, which is recorded in just seven verses. Jesus and his disciples had set out to cross to the other side of the Sea of Galilee when a severe storm blew up. Jesus was asleep in the back of the boat and the disciples panicked. They woke Jesus up and said, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" Jesus simply stood up and spoke to the wind and the waves saying, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind died down and it was completely calm. The disciples were both terrified and amazed and said to each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!" At that point they knew something of his power and authority but still had so much to learn about him. "Who is this?" is the question that we all need to understand the answer to. Firstly, and most importantly, Jesus is God and the creator of the heavens and the earth – no wonder the winds and the waves obeyed him. Then Jesus is the Saviour of the world. People often think in terms of Jesus being a teacher, a righteous man who came as an example to us and a miracle worker, but he came as Saviour. Because he is God, he was the only one who could pay the price for our sins by dying upon the cross. The Bible tells us that he is also our judge and that one day we must all answer to him about our response to him in this life. The Easter response "Christ has died! Christ has risen! Christ will come again!" reminds us that he will return and that then everyone will recognise that He is Lord.

As I wrote this piece for Bridgemedia, as I often do, I looked out of the window over my garden pond to see what the birds were up to. Looking at the birds reminds me of something Jesus said that makes me smile. "Do not worry about your life... Look at the birds of the air..."

The pond and cascade are such a draw for birds to drink and bathe and preen. At popular times of day there may be up to a dozen birds bathing or queuing for their favourite spot. Sometimes I can't actually see the bird but just a great shower of water – it's usually a blackbird.

The biggest bird by far to visit the pond is a heron. They look huge close up! They are now a rare visitor as they now know I have no fish. While the smallest, very special visitor this year, even smaller than the wren, was a gold crest – seen just a couple of times bathing in the cascade in the peaceful early evening.

My current favourite, almost daily visitor, since spring is Jake the drake - he's just flown in. His partner Jemima the duck only pays very quick visits these days as she has a nest elsewhere. So for her it's eat, drink, wash, preen, repeat and fly away. If we haven't noticed their arrival which may be as early as 5:30am they tap on the patio door!

Jake the drake will happily while away many hours 'resting his feathers' on or by the pond while Jemima does all the work on the nest! The other day he was resting in one of his favourite spots below the cascade when a couple of gold finches flew in. They are great fun to watch – they are very flitty, flighty birds. Jake was not amused! He gave them 'the look' but in the end retreated to the other side of the pond to get some peace and quiet.

I don't think when Jesus said "look at the birds" he meant all day! I'll just finish the words Jesus said to his disciples "Do not worry about your life... Look at the birds of the air... your heavenly Father feeds them... And you are much more valuable than they. Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life"? I help to look after the birds but how much more my loving heavenly Father looks after me. That's something that really puts a smile on my face.
