***“I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you.” Joshua 1:5***

Some of you reading this will have heard King George VI's Christmas broadcast in 1939, just over three months after the outbreak of the Second World War. In it he quoted from Minnie Louise Haskins' poem:

**“And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown.”**

And he replied, **“Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way.”**

The Bible reading above is the words of God to Joshua as he took over the leading of the people of Israel after the death of Moses. Those words to Joshua were perhaps what inspired the poet to write the poem last century. In fact God also said to Joshua, **“Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid. Do not be discouraged.”** I wonder if you ever feel like that. Life on a personal level is getting more difficult as health and mobility present problems. The world around no longer seems to make any sense. Life almost seems a bit too much! Perhaps, like me, you need to keep reminding yourself of those words, **“Put your hand into the Hand of God.”** and **“I will be with you always.”**
